Dr. Hill announced that there would be training classes on show ring behavior held on the three Sundays prior to the Show.

Mrs. Cox reported that \$556.50 worth of advertisements shad been pledged to date. She announced that she expected additional ads and pledges for tickets to the Show to be given to children.

Miss Marie Smith announced that a poster contest had been held in the public shoools to publicize the Dog Show. The prize winning posters will be exhibited in Ellis Stone's window. Bladwins will have puppies in their window. Radio and television programs have been arranged and there will be a feature article in the Durham Herald about the Show.

Mrs. Moore called the Club's attention to the series of dog articles now being run in the Sunday papers. The Secretary was instructed to write Mr. Steed Rollins expressing the Club's appreciation for these articles at the conclusion of the series.

A movie made by the Chicago Kennel Club demonstrating the fine points of dog judging was shown to the Club.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
