It was reported that Miss Ledford had received a letter from Mr. Moss in which he stated that his ring cords were not strong enough to support curtains. The Club decided to drop further consideration of this matter.

Dr. Kamin, reporting for the Trophy Committee, announced pledges of approximately \$350.00. This figure includes cash pledges and cigarettes.

Mrs. Moore announced that copies of the publicity pictures could be purchased for \$1.00 each.

Mrs. Hoenig reported that \$660.00 worth of advertising had been sold.

Mrs. Moore told the Club that \$8\$.00 had been contributed to pay for tickets for children.

Miss Rhine said that 8 issues of the Kennel Club News had cost a total of \$49.00. Dr. Kamin moved that the Club vote an additional \$50.00 for this project, Mr. Scanlon seconded, and the motion passed.

Mrs. Moore announced that a "Show Handling Class" would be held in the Star Warehouse on Wednesday, March 16th at 7:30 p.m.

Mrs. Moore announced that all Club members and persons exhibiting dogs in the Show were invited to a cocktail party and buffet supper to be given by the Durham Kennel Club at the home of Mrs. Mary Bowden the night prior to the Show.

The President appointed Mr. Ector Morris and Mr. Cal Matthews to audit the Treasurer's books.

Mrs. Hoenig distributed bumper stickers and posters advertising the Show. She easked that the members place them in strategic spots.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
