MINUTES

REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

Monday Night, May 25, 1964

The regular monthly meeting was called to order at 7:40 P.M., by President Nell White, at the Tip Top Fish House on Hillsboro Road. Those present were permitted to order direct from the regular menu at \$1.75 per person.

There were only 15 members present with four (4) guests, for a total of 19. Guests were Dr. and Mrs. John Lambert, Jr. and Mrs. Lacy Herndon from Raleigh and Mr. William Hotelling of Durham.

Vivian Haines, acting Treasurer, reported a January 1 balance of \$669.87 as compared to a balance in the bank on May 15th, of \$1,976.74. Savings Account balance was \$1,750.69 for a net worth of \$3,727.41.

Show Chairman Betsy Rhine gave a report on the March 1964 show. No figures are reported in these minutes due to vagueness of figures.

In an obvious attempt to railroad the nominees into office, President White asked for a motion of approval without asking for nominations from the floor. The Secretary objected because it was contrary to the Constitution and By-Laws. Nominations from the floor were then requested. There being none, a motion by Howard Haines, seconded by Douglas Hill, that: "The nominations be closed." Motion carried.

Following dinner, Dot Bullock introduced Dr. John Lambert, Jr., the principal speaker of the evening. Dr. Lambert's address was on Pembroke Welsh Corgis. His address and answers to all questions were quite interesting and authoritative, Dr. Lambert being one of the breed's outstanding breeders in this country. Dr. Lambert also presented a film, produced in England, in which many of that country's finest champions was shown and which also showed the breed in many working fields. The program was one of the most interesting and enlightening the Durham Kennel Club has had in recent months.


