This is NOT a puppy socialization class. Handling class is not the place to bring puppies or dogs that are not in control, not leash-trained to walk without constantly pulling, lunging or jumping. Dogs should be able to take direction from their owners, stand still and allow touching and examination by an instructor or "judge." We are willing to work with you, but safety for instructors, other students and dogs must come first. If your dog has any aggression issues to other dogs or people, this is not the class to work on those issues. You'll be asked to leave class if your dog exhibits aggression to dogs or people (per the DKC class guidelines posted on the building wall).

If your female is in **HEAT** you may come to class, but she **MUST** have britches on. She presents a huge distraction to highly interested males who may target her and challenge other males. Ideally, every handler will have 100% control of his dog and keep it on a short lead, but not everyone is at that stage. Keep this in mind when bringing a dog in heat to class.
